

Launch of the ASAP 2.0 Protocol for coordinated response to domestic violence against women and children

9 April 2024

Working with individuals who commit domestic violence is crucial in addressing abuse. This principle underpins the <u>ASAP 2.0</u> project, which aims to prevent male violence against women and children by enhancing perpetrator programmes and fostering coordinated responses. Since 2022, the ASAP 2.0 team has worked on developing a standardised methodology for the collaboration between **perpetrator programmes and victim support services**, and with critical actors in the system for risk assessment and case management.

After two years of engagement with this theme in Italy, Bulgaria, Cyprus and Greece, we are proud to unveil the ASAP 2.0 Protocol. This lays the framework for improved collaboration among professionals in perpetrator programmes and domestic violence victim support services. It provides a universally applicable and adaptable structure suitable for addressing all instances of domestic violence, accommodating each organisation and country's specific capacities and contexts.
