# The "Responsible Together" Perpetrator Work Campaign 2018

We chose 2018 to call for shared responsibility to end violence against women.

### **Shared Responsibility**

The 2018 WWP EN "Responsible Together" Perpetrator Work Campaign serves as a symbol and a promise to continue the support of gender equality and non-violence through responsible perpetrator work based on safety, accountability and cooperation.

The WWP EN campaign provides information on perpetrator work, and identifies, clarifies and works toward eliminating misconceptions about perpetrator programmes through activities and materials.

#### **Activities**

During the 2018 <u>16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence</u>, we asked participating members to fight against prejudices and to spread knowledge about their perpetrator programmes.

The campaigners were incredible and organised everything from film screenings to charity concerts, solidarity marches and street actions. Read some more about the events below or on our website!

#### **Materials**

We developed a range of campaign materials which address different issues around perpetrator work:

- The <u>flyer</u> addresses the most common misconceptions and critiques towards perpetrator programmes. It supports a dialogue and exchange between critics and perpetrator programmes.
- The <u>poster</u> gives an overview of the areas perpetrator programmes work in and shows the importance of perpetrator work for holistic community-based interventions against gender-based violence.
- The <u>postcard</u> speaks to perpetrators directly and covers a range of abusive behaviours, such as financial, psychological and physical violence, aiding in spreading information about different kinds of abuse.
