2020 WWP EN Annual Conference

Due to the ongoing uncertainty around travel restrictions and future waves of COVID-19, the WWP EN Annual Conference 2020 will take place in a virtual format.



As in previous years, WWP EN brings together international experts on domestic violence. In 2020, the focus of the Annual Conference is on the relationship of prison, probation and perpetrator work. It will take place **online**.

Perpetrator programmes are part of a wider strategy for preventing domestic and sexual violence, through fostering change as well as ensuring responsible risk assessment and management. Perpetrator programmes offered as part of the prison and probation system can pose a number of specific challenges – these may be related to the particular setting they are delivered in, to multiagency work, or victim support.

The conference will explore these challenges and provide space for discussions on how to ensure that interventions are as effective and safe as possible. An important factor in this is strengthening cooperation between prison or probation services and community-based organisations where these deliver perpetrator programmes on behalf of the criminal justice system.

The first conference day is dedicated to perpetrator work in the probation context, while the second day examines the chances and challenges of perpetrator programmes in prisons.

WWP EN Expert Paper: Probation and prison based programmes for perpetrators of domestic and sexual violence

The WWP EN Expert Paper on "Probation and prison-based programmes for perpetrators of domestic and sexual violence" is now available online.



In the paper, Sandra Jovanović Belotić (OPNA) gives an overview of the probation or prison based programmes for perpetrators in Europe. The paper focuses on programmes for perpetrators of domestic violence and gives an insight into programmes led by probation/prison services, as well as NGOs and other agencies linked with the criminal justice system. Programmes for sexual offenders are briefly elaborated, mostly through the prism of the connections between sexual and domestic violence perpetrator programmes.

Italy was the first European country to go into full lockdown. The team of the Florence-based Centro di Ascolto Uomini Maltrattanti (<u>CAM</u>) sat down and answered some questions about how they dealt with the challenges posed by COVID-19.

"In the second phase of lockdown, conflicts and violence intensified. From 18 May, when the lockdown became more relaxed, many men started seeking support from CAM. In May and June 2020 we recorded twice as many calls form men than in previous year."

The Caledonian System - Scotland

The Caledonian System is the national Scottish accredited court mandated response to domestic abuse. It consists of a men's behaviour change programme delivered by criminal justice social workers, a support, advocacy and safety planning service for the men's partners, a children's service and a model for inter-agency working which promotes a perpetrator pattern focus in all agencies' responses to domestic abuse.





CIPM - Italy

CIPM was founded in March 1995 and aims to prevent violence and manage its effects via an integrated and interdisciplinary model of criminological intervention. We conduct social cohesion and educational activities and implement treatment programs for perpetrators to prevent re-offending, particularly in the areas of sexual violence, intimate partner /domestic violence.

MARVOW

At the start of May, we met (virtually) with MARVOW partners for the second international meeting and the train the trainers meeting. Over two days, we discussed project updates and important aspects of the multi-agency cooperation model we're developing. WWP EN's Executive Director Alessandra Pauncz also delivered a presentation on how to better include perpetrator work when developing this model. 15 June saw "World Elder Abuse Awareness Day" which MARVOW project partners marked by a 4-day long thematic campaign. The campaign highlighted the struggles faced by elderly victims of domestic violence, especially when they have to live with their abusers during lockdown, with elderly women being the most affected by this. <u>FOMEN</u>

The second international partner meeting for FOMEN took place (virtually) in April, with two days full of project discussions. We also discussed the capacity building and intervention programmes, which will be developed within the framework of the project. An extension of the project due to the COVID-19 restrictions has been accepted by the European Commission. Also, the FOMEN website has been updated with a new layout and new descriptions, so make sure to take a look.

MiC

In the framework of the MiC project, we produced an information sheet (in English and German) about caring responsibilities during the COVID-19 lockdown. The document explores topics such as violence prevention, gender justice and the organisation of family work and can be found here.
