FATHERS GROUPS IN ITALY AND AUSTRIA

The [Fathers Rock](#) team has developed educational modules for fathers' groups which will act as spaces for reflection on masculinity, fatherhood and dealing with conflicting and challenging situations. Simultaneously, it is conducting a capacity-building programme for perinatal and early childhood services to support them in engaging fathers and addressing gender-based violence. The programme is underway in Spain, Italy and Austria.



IMPROVING TEACHERS' AND PARENTS' KNOWLEDGE ON ONLINE ABUSE

A key aspect of the [Consent](#) project is to improve the knowledge of teachers and parents on online abuse and youngsters' access to pornography and their capability to detect and tackle these issues. The project team is implementing a training programme for parents and teachers to raise awareness of the risks facing youth and how adults can support and safeguard youngsters.





IMPROVING POLICE RESPONSES TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

Due to the complexity of domestic violence, collaboration between the police and other essential services is vital when tackling domestic violence. Our new project, [TACTICS](#), will build the capacities of police and other frontline workers, including those from perpetrator programmes, to provide an improved response to domestic violence cases. After the kick-off meeting on 8 May, we will officially begin working on the project.



IMPROVING THE EFFECTIVENESS OF PERPETRATOR PROGRAMMES

As the [ASAP 2.0](#) project enters its second year, the team is focused on enhancing the capabilities of perpetrator programs, victim support services and other stakeholders to improve the effectiveness of perpetrator work and reduce harm to victims of violence.

Towards the end of this year, the ASAP 2.0 team will finalise the finetuning of the ASAP 2.0 protocol and deliver national recommendations for perpetrator work in multiagency cooperation. The recommendations will outline how to conduct impactful work with perpetrators in ordinary and extraordinary circumstances. Stay tuned to our newsletter for more information on the publications.

TRAINING PROFESSIONALS IN ITALY TO COMBAT GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE

Through the [Change](#) project, 295 frontline professionals in Italy have been trained using the [Engage](#) training pathway. Additionally, the team has trained 18 perpetrator programme professionals to use the [IMPACT toolkit](#). These activities will contribute towards improved response to gender-based violence in Italy's Friuli Venezia Giulia and Veneto regions. PRACTITIONERS CAPACITY BUILDING ON PERPETRATOR WORK

At the upcoming "Practitioners capacity building on multiagency cooperation and monitoring and evaluation of perpetrator work" in September, WWP will conduct training for the ISEDA project partners. Meanwhile, the [ISEDA consortium](#) is busy planning the establishment of the Iseida European Community of Practice - CoP. The European CoP will engage domestic violence practitioners in developing ISEDA solutions and ensure the expansion of ISEDA solutions at a European scale. The CoP will also include CSOs and policymakers interested in adopting ISEDA results to their contexts.
